The afternoon begins with a driving tour of Nashville where such sights as Music Row, 2nd Avenue, Broadway, and the Tennessee State Capitol may be seen. Our first official stop is to the Ryman Auditorium, one of Nashville's signature historical country music landmarks and home to the Grand Ole Opry from 1943 to 1974. Our final stop is for lunch at the Two Twenty Two Grill and a tour at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, the world's largest research center dedicated to a single form of American music. The museum recently unveiled a S100 million expansion doubling its size to 350,000 square feet of dynamic state-of-the-art galleries, archival storage.
